

1. How to register for Japanese classes



Select classes from those classes at your level listed in "A guide for selecting Japanese classes according to your student status" (p. 6 ~).





It is not recommended to take classes lower than your level.

Registration (rishuu tooroku;履修登録) is to April 10th.

Read the syllabus and register for your Japanese classes on SOSEKI.



Look at the Moodle course of your class by April 10th. XIf you cannot see the Moodle course that you registered, it means that you have not completed your registration on SOSEKI.

※Adjustment of registration (rishuu tooroku shuusei; 履修登録修正) is April 11th (Thu.) - April 17th (Wed.). In this period you can change or cancel the classes you have registered for on SOSEKI.

Please take classes appropriate to your Japanese level. Please note that you cannot earn any credits from Japanese classes.

Please apply for Japanese classes on SOSEKI by April 10th. Graduate students and research students (i.e., auditors) can register for Japanese classes on SOSEKI from Spring semester, 2022. If you fail to register for a class on SOSEKI, you will not be able to see the course you applied on Moodle. If you wish to change your registration, you will be able to do it by April 17th.

You can audit Japanese classes from your Japanese level. However, you cannot earn any credits for Japanese classes. Your grade (G [pass, \Leftrightarrow], F [fail \Leftrightarrow], drop [\times]) will not affect your GPA.

(5) Japanese Language Trainees (Nihongo Kenshuusei) [N]

Japanese language trainees are students who have passed the examination offered at Japanese embassies of their countries and will enroll in the preparatory six-month Japanese language course.

There are two categories:

- a) Japanese government (MEXT) scholarship students with embassy recommendations
- b) Teacher-training students

If your Japanese level is elementary (K1-K3), please take <u>Intensive Japanese Course</u>. If your Japanese level is intermediate or higher, please consult with the full-time instructor in advance. (\rightarrow p.13, 16)

6. Credit

Regular Students in Undergraduate School [U]

Undergraduate students who need Japanese language course credits for their Compulsory Foreign Language subject requirements should complete the credits required for graduation within their first two years. Even if you take more Compulsory Foreign Language subjects than are required, those credits will not count toward your graduation requirements. Credits obtained from Elective Foreign Language subjects will count toward your graduation requirements for elective classes.

Special Undergraduate Auditors [SU-S] [SU] [SU-J]

There is no distinction between Compulsory Foreign Language subjects and Elective Foreign Language subjects. Both will count toward your program completion requirements.

Graduate Students, Special Auditors and Special Research Students in Graduate School,

Japanese Language Trainees (Nihongo Kensyuu Sei), Undergraduate Reserch Students /

Graduate Research Students [G] [SG] [N] [R] [O]

You may audit courses that correspond to your Japanese level, but you can not earn credit for them.


General Education Building locate at Kurokami North campus.
