

Please take classes appropriate to your Japanese level. Please note that you cannot earn any credits from Japanese classes.

Please apply for Japanese classes <u>on SOSEKI</u> by April 10th. Graduate students and research students (i.e., auditors) can register for Japanese classes on SOSEKI from Spring semester, 2022. If you fail to register for a class on SOSEKI, you will not be able to see the course you applied on Moodle. If you wish to change your registration, you will be able to do it <u>by April 17th</u>.

You can audit Japanese classes from your Japanese level. However, you cannot earn any credits for Japanese classes. Your grade (G [pass, \triangle], F [fail \triangle], drop [×]) will not affect your GPA.

(5) Japanese Language Trainees (Nihongo Kenshuusei) [N]

Japanese language trainees are students who have passed the examination offered at Japanese embassies of their countries and will enroll in the preparatory six-month Japanese language course.

There are two categories:

a) Japanese government (MEXT) scholarship students with embassy recommendations

b) Teacher-training students

If your Japanese level is elementary (K1-K3), please take <u>Intensive Japanese Course</u>. If your Japanese level is intermediate or higher, please consult with the full-time instructor in advance. (\rightarrow p.14, 16)

6. Credit

Regular Students in Undergraduate School (U)

Undergraduate students who need Japanese language course credits for their <u>Compulsory Foreign Language subject</u> requirements should complete the credits required for graduation within their first two years. Even if you take more Compulsory Foreign Language subjects than are required, those credits will not count toward your graduation requirements. Credits obtained from <u>Elective Foreign Language subjects</u> will count toward your graduation requirements for elective classes.

Special Undergraduate Auditors [SU-S] [SU] [SU-J]

There is no distinction between Compulsory Foreign Language subjects and Elective Foreign Language subjects. Both will count toward your program completion requirements.

You may audit courses that correspond to your Japanese level, but you can not earn credit for them.

- Attendance of less than two-thirds will result in an "X" (Withdrawal).

- Transcripts will be marked with the following abbreviations; AA, A, B, C, F and X.
- If you cancel your registration within the period of adjustment of registration(*rishuu tooroku henkoo kikan*), nothing to be noted on your transcript.






